Man's energy requirement from food are usually measured in kilo/calories. The daily total required by a healthy adult in Europe varies from 4240 for an active manual worker to about 2100 for a man with an inactive sedentary job. In the tropics, the levels are slightly lower. Energy is most easily and quickly derived from a carbohydrate diet such as cereals (Wheat, rice on other grains) and tubers as potato, the sweet potato and cassava.

But in addition to providing energy a balanced diet must include proteins, fats, vitamins and mineral salts of various kinds. It is possible, therefore, to have plenty to eat,

but if this consists of quantity rather than quality, then malnutrition can result. One of the most widespread deficiencies in the diet of people in developing countries is animal protein such as meat, fish, milk, cheese and eggs. Deficiency disease such as pellagea, rickets, beri beri and some forms of anaemia may result when the diet consists largely of one type of carbohydrate food material and lacks vitamins.

The world production of protein foods is increasing each year by about 1.5 percent. This is a long way behind the rate of population growth, so that it is estimated that in 1985 the people in highly populated developing countries will be getting less protein, not more-the average falling from 14.4 grams per person per day to 9.6 grams.
